Just in case you think that winter is a slow time for me and Deanlea business I want to tell you that it isn't. I attend all Tiny Council meetings to keep myself abreast of any policies that may affect Deanlea.

Most private beaches are having problems preventing outsiders from using their beach. They leave behind garbage, use the beach for bathroom facilities and add to crowding. The previous council came to the conclusion that the only way to control access to beaches is through parking. This Council is committed to addressing parking issues and believes that public engagement is crucial to this process. To date, Council held a Town Hall meeting on November 14, 2015, dedicated to the topic of beach usage, maintenance and access/parking as well as a Special Committee of the Whole Meeting on January 13, 2016, regarding a Township parking strategy.

The purpose of the meeting was to listen to the public's input and to strive to implement a consistent, fair parking strategy that meets the needs of the community as a whole. Public consultation is a critical part of this process and Council is anxious to hear from individual beach associations.

At the January meeting I did a short presentation regarding Deanlea Beach Parking concerns. I pointed out to Council that we did not want to see an increase in parking spots for Bluewater because we receive the overflow when the beach is crowded. I also asked them to consider erecting No Parking signs on Bay St.. Concession 4, Pine Forest Dr. and Prince Albert Pkwy have No Parking signs which makes Bay the first street from the public beach with unrestricted parking. I also recommended that all parking spots be permit spots

are our neighbours and we share recreational facilities with them. Tiny does not have a library or an indoor arena or pool. The Township will sell 150 non-resident permits on a first come, first serve basis at a cost of \$113.

Council is still working through the finalization of the strategic plan.

Even though I look onto snow thoughts of spring and summer are not far from my mind. I have looked at the calendar and noticed that the last Saturday of June is neither Fathers Day weekend nor the July 1 weekend. So our AGM will fall on Saturday June 25, at 1 pm. We choose the Saturday because cottage residents are going back home on Sunday.
