Notice is hereby given that the Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the Deanlea Beach Association will be held on Saturday, August 29, 2020 at 10:00 am - 12:00 noon outdoors at the Boat Ramp on Henry's Rd. This is a conditional location and date. If the morning is windy and it is hard to hear due to high waves, notice will be given after 9:00 am and the AGM will be moved to Glen Ave. N. in front of the Bulletin Board. If the morning is rainy,

notice will be given after 9:00 am and the AGM will be delayed to Sunday, August 30, 2020 at 10:00-12:00 at the Boat Ramp. Same location conditions apply. Social distancing will be observed. Please try to come out and bring a chair for each resident attending.

The list of topics to be discussed include: financial position; FoTTSA issues (high water levels; water testing; Teedon Gravel

Pit); nomination & election of new Board members; property & maintenance; future Fun Day; and communication. WATER TESTING

The Federation of Tiny Township Shoreline Associations (FoTTSA) has organized the local beach volunteer water testing program again this year. We thank Christine Gaiotto for going deep for our benefit to take water samples at 2 locations on the day following each summer weekend. The samples are tested for E. coli bacteria each week. Over the years, our beach at Red Rock (now submerged!) has had a remarkably clean record among all Tiny beaches with E. coli counts of 20 (per 100 mL) or less for the majority of the summer weeks. We saw very high readings after the big Sunday storm on July 19 but most weeks have been very good. Historical water testing results for Tiny are available from FoTTSA.

Health Canada and the Simcoe-Muskoka District Health Unit sets the following contamination limits for primary contact activities (swimming) in fresh water:

- a geometric mean concentration (minimum of five samples) ≤ 200 E. coli/100 mL; and
 - a single-sample maximum concentration ≤ 400 E. coli/100 mL.
- Please continue to observe good septic tank management and hygiene practices in our shared water resource.

DEANLEA BEACH FRIENDLY REMINDERS

On behalf of our neighbours and the Deanlea Beach Association (DBA), we would like to thank you for respecting our efforts to keep Deanlea Beach environmentally friendly and safe. As property owners, you are asked to share our “Friendly Reminders” with your family, friends and renters.

Beach:

- Deanlea is a “family friendly” beach.
- Please use the buddy system and be aware of undertows and changing water levels.
- Avoid the use of glass on the beach, when possible.
- Take your garbage and cigarette butts with you when you leave the beach.
- Bring your beach furniture with you at the end of the day.
- Fill in sand holes before you leave the beach. This is a serious walking hazard, especially at night!
- Do not feed the seagulls.
- Please help preserve our dunes by minimizing walking on the dune grasses.

Boating/Watercraft:

Please use and anchor motorized watercraft in the boating zone marked by posts and signs. Please be aware that motorized vessels must operate at speeds ≤ 10 km/h within 300 m of our shore. (Transport Canada, Vessel Operation Restriction Regulations, Schedule 6, Item 28.)

Dogs:

In July and August, the DBA requests a dog-free beach between noon and 5 pm. Dogs must be leashed and please remember to “poop and scoop” and take it back to your cottage.

Fires:

The Tiny Open Air Burning By-law 15-027 allows fires on your property with a Class A Fire Permit and a proper fire pit. The By-law prohibits the burning of leaves and pine needles. Fire bans are imposed in very dry weather. Check for fire bans and the Tiny Fire Hazard Index at www.tiny.ca/Pages/Fire-Rating.aspx. Class A Fire Permits can be obtained for \$25/season from the Township of Tiny website, the Township of Tiny Municipal Office in Perkinsfield, Wyevale Jug City, or the Elmvale Esso (County Rd. 92 & County Rd. 29). Fires are NOT allowed on the beach at any time.

Parking:

Parking is NOT permitted on the gravel roads owned by the DBA or the municipal (paved) roads. Vehicles will be ticketed or towed if illegally parked.

Noise:

Respect your neighbours and be considerate of others at the beach.

- Please do not play loud music outdoors (Tiny Noise By-law 11-065).
- Have fun, but also consider your surroundings - this is a family friendly beach community. Unruly behaviour and the use of profanity can be offensive and are unacceptable.
- If you are having a party, tell your neighbour(s). If noise or music is too loud, try speaking to your neighbour(s) first, before calling By-law.

Safety:

Please use extreme caution and low speed when driving on Deanlea Beach roads (paved municipally owned and gravel roads). Watch for pedestrians - especially children around footpaths. Motorized vehicles are NOT permitted on the beach or footpaths, with the exceptions of: emergency vehicles, to launch/retrieve watercraft at Henry's Rd. boat launch, and equipment set-up/garbage removal on Fun Day.

Waste:

Deanlea Beach falls under Zone 2 and pick-up is every Monday including most holidays. Garbage and recycling are collected on alternating weeks, and green bin organics are picked up weekly. Garbage limits are 2 untagged bags (80 L or 20 kg each) and 6 tagged bags per collection. Extra tags can be purchased (\$15 for 5) at Wyevale Jug City and the Tiny Municipal Office in Perkinsfield. As a reminder, it is important to note that Deanlea Beach Association fees are necessary to keep this land private, providing members with access to the common land (beach, footpaths and unpaved roads). Annual costs that must be paid in order to keep our beach private!! They also cover the following:

- Property Taxes for Common Land
- Liability Insurance for the DBA and the Common Land
- Annual Financial Statements and CRA filings for the DBA
- Road Maintenance of the unpaved roads (excluding winter plowing)
- Property Maintenance of the Common Land, e.g. dangerous/dead trees
